The Senior Army ROTC program consists of four years of Military Science and Leadership (MSCL) courses with both lower and upper division levels. The first two years (100 and 200 level) of MSCL courses are offered via CWI. They are open to all interested students and do not require a military obligation or commitment to the Army. Students enroll in lower division Army ROTC/MSCL lecture courses by registering for them in the same manner in which they would sign up for other college courses during the registration period. Students need to obtain permission from the ROTC Enrollment Officer or Instructor Permission (see Instructors Tab) prior to registering. All Army ROTC/MSCL courses taken through CWI will appear on a CWI transcript and are fully transferrable to any university with an Army ROTC program.

Military Science (Army ROTC) helps students develop and fine-tune leadership skills and self-confidence while earning a college degree of choice. Students will gain skills that are sought after in both the military and civilian workforce. Students will also forge new friendships and memories that will last a lifetime. Upon graduation with an associate's degree, transfer to obtain a bachelor degree and completion of all of the training and academic requirements of the program, those individuals will not only be a college graduate, but also a commissioned Officer in the Army, National Guard, or Army Reserve. Army ROTC is not a degree program/major by itself, Military Science courses are completed alongside an associate degree program of choice through CWI.

Two-thirds of all US Army Officers receive their commission through the Army ROTC.
